




TODAY'S FOREST

Forest Management Planning for Private Forest Landowners



Is this the future of your forest?

Workshops will be co-taught by Dr. Peter Kolb – the Montana State University Extension Forestry Specialist who directs the Montana Forest Stewardship program and has worked with wildfire resilience and rehabilitation for more than 26 years.

Nebraska:

Sunday, June 9 – 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm at Chadron State Park, Central Building, 15851 S. Hwy 385, about 8 miles south of Chadron.

Forest landowners want to be sure that their land will provide, and continue to provide, specific and personal benefits whether these be wildlife, timber, grazing or others. However to achieve this goal requires a good understanding of the basic principles of forestry and a plan. Participants in this 3-hour workshop will learn about inventorying the resources on their land, setting management goals and developing a stewardship plan.
